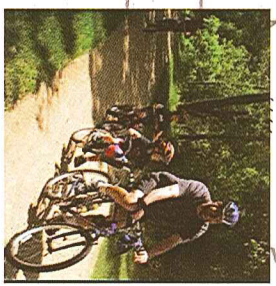

## The Red Cedar State Trail

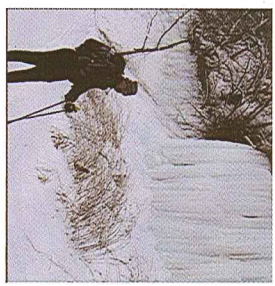
### Menomonie to Irvington (2.7 miles)

The Visitor's Center, information, maps, water, restrooms and ample parking are all found at the trailhead in Menomonie. The flowing waters of the Red Cedar River and the colorful rock outcroppings that hug this section of trail define its rugged character.



### Irvington to Downsville (4.3 miles)

A small parking area in Irvington provides access to the trail. This section of trail intermittently moves away from the river, entering woods, wetlands and meadows. Restrooms and water are not available.

### Downsville to Dunnville Bottoms (6.7 miles)

Water, restrooms and parking are available next to the trail in Downsville. This part of the trail takes you through deep forests and the vast Dunnville Bottoms Wildlife Area. The trail ends as it crosses the Chippewa River and intersects the 24-mile Chippewa River State Trail.
